2.14 Significant Activities and contributions made by IQAC

Plan of Action Chalked Out By IQAC of the College

1. Plan to introduce new courses i.e. 10+1 and 10+2 in Arts and Commerce stream from Punjab School Education Board, Mohali.
2. A National Seminar on the theme 'Quality Assurance and Quality Sustenance in Higher Education' on 16th March, 2016.
3. An Extension lecture on 'Linguistics' and 'Literary Criticism' was conducted for the students of M.A.(English) by Dr. Deepti Gupta and Dr. Anil Raina, both from the Dept. of English and Culture Studies, Panjab University, Chandigarh.

4. Orientation of new students towards the code of conduct of the college, regularity in attendance, internal assessment, and also towards various inter and intra college activities in the field of academics, cultural and sports.
5. Strengthening of the Placement cell, Job Fest was organised on 26th May, 2016 thereby more than 250 students participated in placement drive. DRIVE AGAINST JUNK FOOD: keeping in view the increase in obesity and eye sight problems in students junk food is banned in the college instead college has passed MOU with Verka milk plant, Patiala to supply all milk drinks and other products. In this way students get nutritious diet and it also help large number of enrolled sports students to get required nutrition.

DRIVE AGAINST DISPOSABLES: Under environment friendly move college all Non degradables including disposables and polythene bags are not allowed in college canteen and college functions.

PHYSICAL AND MENTAL WELL BEING of Teachers and Students: Yoga camp and stress free workshops are arranged throughout year to maintain quality of thinking, educating, learning and relearning.

EMPANELMENT OF A PSYCHOLOGIST COUNSELLOR: Keeping in view the increasing behavior problems among students due to stress. Dr Poonam Sharma a psychologist is deputed by trust to visit college twice in a week. She also delivers common lectures to students about drug de- addiction, time and stress management.

11. Special Classes are held in autumn break and Winter break for those who fall shortage of lectures as per university rules.

7.2 Provide Action Taken Report ATR Based On The Plan Of Action Decided Upon At The Beginning Of The Year.

In the beginning of the session 2015-16, IQAC meeting was held to plan out the activities and execute the policies to uplift the level of education. 7.3 Give Two Best Practices

1. Gender Champions

Gobindgarh Public College (Alour -Khanna) has taken an initiative to create a better society free from all sorts of gender discrimination. As per instructions given on UGC, New Delhi website, the college formulated an organized procedure to appoint one male and one female Gender Champion...

Process begin by inviting the nominations for gender champion by displaying a notice in the college. The screening committee received 24 nominations-12 boys and 12-girls. In the interview, the candidates were assessed on the basis of their intelligence, decisiveness, awareness and honesty which are essential qualities of a leader. Under the supervision of the Nodal officers (one male and one female teacher), students were allowed to share their views on the issues related to gender bias prevalent in the society. They also shared their yearlong activities to promote gender equality. Hence, the NODAL teachers acted as mentor for students to facilitate the activities of the nominated students. The elected gender champions will try to transform the thinking of people by awareness programmer such as street plays, painting competitions etc. they will try to eliminate the social vices. The college also organize workshops/extension lecture for the training of Gender Champions from time to time.

2. To promote the students to use bicycle, institute waives off full annual tuition fees of those students who commute to college via bicycle. This scheme not only checks environment pollution but also help students to get concession in college fees.

7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness/protection:

Gobindgarh public college is deeply concerned about the Environment, and is proactive in developing, maintaining and preserving the clean environment. The college constantly tries to promote greenery and develop eco-friendly environment. Since the inception of the college, it has tried to develop its natural surroundings and covered the beautification part of the Campus in a phased manner over a period of ten years. 4. Seven days NSS camp was organized by NSS program officers Prof. Gaurav Verma and Prof. Bangera Rupinder Kaur from .The theme of NSS camp was "Healthy India". The camp was organized in the village Anjali. During the camp the students has started cleanliness drive in the college and educate the people about environment awareness and protection.



