6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by Institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Principal is member of Academic Council and Board of Studies for Graduate and Post Graduate. Faculty members were the members of U.G Board of Studies in Political Science. & Human Rights & duties and Hindi. House tests, class tests are conducted according to university Norms, subject allocation as per specialization of teachers. Two Career-Oriented Certificate courses (Communicative English and Computer Based Accounting) were introduced is running. College is running informal certificate course of PDP, Music, IT and special free bus facilities are provided. Teachers and students from commerce, management and computer departments gave suggestions to respective Board of Studies of Panjab University to update the conventional syllabus of Commerce, Management and Computer stream.

In order to develop awareness for environment, the following actions has been taken in the college during the session 2016-17



