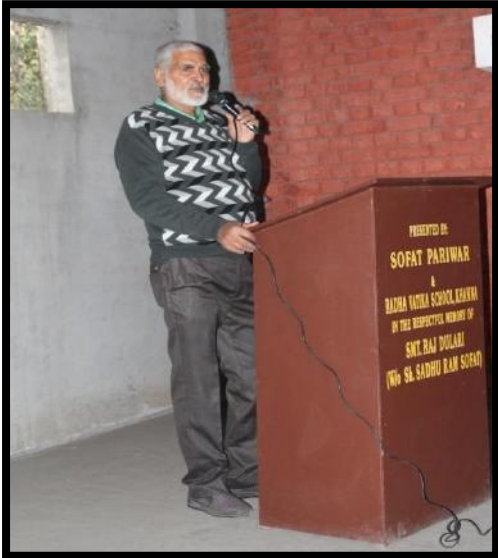
(Fourth Day)




